- 1. It will comply with all applicable requirements of *The Workplace Safety and Heath Act* and regulations thereunder.
- 2. Where the contract award value for the Project is \$100,000 or greater:

- a. Bidders with employees working on the Project must have a valid and current CORTM, SECORTM certificate or evidence of equivalency issued in accordance with the Canadian Federation of Construction Safety Associations CORTM program and verified by either the Manitoba Heavy Construction Association Work Safely Program or by the Construction Safety Association of Manitoba to work on the Project.
- b. Subcontractors are not required to declare status in a safety program, <u>until January 1</u>, 2012.
- c. <u>Beginning January 1, 2012</u>, subcontractors with employees working on the Project must show safety program registration or evidence of equivalency verified by either the Manitoba Heavy Construction Association Work Safely Program or by the Construction Safety Association of Manitoba.
- 3. <u>Beginning January 1, 2014, and regardless of project value,</u> all Bidders and Subcontractors (with employees working on the Project) must have a valid and current CORTM or SECORTM certificate, or evidence of equivalency issued in accordance with the Canadian Federation of Construction Safety Associations CORTM program and verified by either the Manitoba Heavy Construction Association Work Safely Program or by the Construction Safety Association of Manitoba to work on the Project.

The Bidder understands that the consequences of making an untrue statement in its Bid, or of not complying with the requirements of this Tender or failing to produce evidence satisfactory to Government of Manitoba regarding this Certification may include the forfeiture of any bid security, disqualification of the Bidder from participating in future tenders and/or the termination of the Contract.

If subcontractors are retained by the Bidder, it will ensure that its subcontractors will provide this same certification to Government of Manitoba before the subcontractor begins work on the Project.
