

**SAFE WORK PRACTICE**

<b>TITLE</b>	Congested Site Safe Work Practices
<b>GENERAL</b>	Protecting workers from injuries associated with congested site safe work
<b>APPLICATION</b>	As per job requirement
<b>PROTECTIVE MECHANISMS</b>	Safe job procedure
<b>SELECTION AND USE</b>	As per safe job procedure
<b>SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITY</b>	Supervisors are responsible to facilitate and/or provide proper instruction to their workers on protection requirements
<b>WORKER RESPONSIBILITY</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Obtain a clear description of work to be performed and safety devices required before leaving the yard to go to the worksite. Mark, store and secure all small safety equipment in the site trailer before moving it to site.</li> <li>2) Check, service and repair all vehicles and machinery before they are taken to site. Oil leaks must be rectified, back-up alarms functioning and all lights working.</li> <li>3) All laborers must have in their possession, their Personal Protective Equipment and are responsible for inspecting it, maintaining it in good condition and securing it at the end of the work day.</li> <li>4) Barricade hazardous sites to prevent employees from other companies from coming in contact with machinery and trucks.</li> <li>5) Never move another company's barricades or enter their site without permission, and even then, only if absolutely necessary. Replace barricades as soon as possible and let someone know when you are leaving the site.</li> <li>6) In case of an accident, incident or hazardous spill occurrence, cease work immediately. Alert the supervisor and nearby workers as to the nature of the problem and perform the necessary corrections before commencing work again.</li> <li>7) Do not assume others will not enter the site, either on purpose or by accident.</li> <li>8) Safeguard all company property at the end of each day</li> <li>9) On congested sites, a watcher is often designated to facilitate the equipment operator in performing his task safely and efficiently.</li> <li>10) All portable fuel containers taken on-site must meet all safety standards and comply with all codes. Between dispensing fuel, the container must be tightly closed, stored in a safe and visible area, and clearly marked with the appropriate WHMIS signage.</li> <li>11) Respect and consideration for coworkers and other trades will facilitate an efficient and safe job site. Be alert to others who are working around you and keep your site safe and clean.</li> </ol>
